Suggested starter activity

- 1 Use a puppet as an opener to the lesson.
- 2 Have the puppet tell pupils about him- or herself, paying keen attention to answering the questions posed in *Get ready* on [page 8](#) of the Student's Book.
- 3 Ask pupils to get into pairs and allow them 5 minutes to tell each other things about themselves.
- 4 A few pupils can be given an opportunity to use the puppet to share two things they learnt about their partner to their fellow classmates.

Extension activity 1

Following on from the *Speaking and listening* exercise on [page 10](#) of the Student's Book, ask pupils to write two or three sentences about their partner in their journal.

Extension activity 2

Following on from the *Writing* exercise on [page 13](#) of the Student's Book, ask pupils to write two or three sentences about themselves in their journal. The focus of these sentences should not just be to provide information about themselves, but to also apply the grammar rules for using full stops.

Fun with sentences

This game can be done before the exercises on page 11 and reviewed before those on page 12 of the Student's Book.

- 1 Use the word cards provided.
- 2 Divide pupils into groups of three or four.
- 3 Each group is given a set of word cards. They must arrange the words on the cards in the order that makes sense, for example:
 - She likes swimming.
 - Tom lives in Kingstown.
 - This is Lisa.
- 4 The group that has the most correctly arranged cards wins the game.
- 5 Next, use the arranged cards to help pupils better understand what a sentence is and to help them distinguish between a sentence and a fragment of a sentence.
